

Regulation Giuseppe Bartolozzi Prize

Art. 1

Prof. Federico Bartolozzi and Prof. Giuseppe Bartolozzi have undertaken to pay every two years the sum of 1.000.000 Lire¹ to the Mathematics Italian Union (UMI) located in Bologna. With this sum UMI sets up a biennial prize of the same amount. The award shall be entitled “Giuseppe Bartolozzi Prize”.

Art. 2

The prize will be awarded through competition. The call shall be announced for the first time within 30th June 1969, for the second time within the 30th June 1971 and so on.

Art. 3

The call announcement will be advertised on ‘Notiziario’ and on UMI website. The expiry day for the submission of the applications shall be at least 60 days after the date of the call announcement.

Art. 4

Those entitled to apply are mathematics scientists whose 34th birthday do not occur by 31st December of the year preceding that one in which the prize is awarded.

Art. 5

Those who will decide to partake in the competition are asked to submit applications to the UMI President, exclusively by electronic means. To the submission shall be attached in PDF format a copy of an identity document proving the nationality and the date of birth, and a copy of a printed publication of high scientific value in the field of mathematics.

Art. 6

The prize is indivisible. The competition will be evaluated by a Commission consisting in 5 members, appointed by UMI Presidency Office.

Art. 7

UMI members, Universities, Research institutes and Scientific academies may submit nominations, within the call deadline, to the UMI President. Submissions shall explicitly specify the scientific publication to be evaluated. In case of more submissions related to different publications of the same candidate, the Commission shall decide which of them take into account for the purposes of the competition. The Commission may contact coauthors of the submitted paper in order to assess the candidate actual contribution to it. In any case candidates shall be in the conditions under article 4 of this Regulation.

Art. 8

Commission resolutions may be adopted with simple majority vote. As regard the scientific content, Commission resolutions are unquestionable.

Art. 9

If the Commission acted not to award the prize, it will be awarded through competition the following year.

Art. 10

¹ UMI by its own action decides to increase the award amount to 1500 euro. UMI undertakes to pay the difference between this amount and the sum paid by the Bartolozzi Family.

The Commission must draw up a detailed report of its works. It will be published on 'Notiziario' and on UMI website.

Art. 11

This Regulation may be amended under the conditions provided in the donation act of Professors Federico and Giuseppe Bartolozzi.
