

Federigo Enriques Prize 2014

Art. 1 The Unione Matematica Italiana (UMI), in collaboration with Centro Studi Enriques, announces the Federigo Enriques Prize, to be assigned to a doctoral dissertation on subjects related to Federigo Enriques's mathematical thought.

Art. 2 Participation is open to all PhD candidates that have defended their doctoral dissertation in mathematics not earlier than two years before the date of the present announcement.

Art. 3 Applications must arrive at UMI, Piazza di Porta San Donato 5, 40126 Bologna, not later than November 30, 2014. The application must contain one hard copy of the doctoral dissertation, together with a brief summary (at most 10 pages), illustrating the original aspects of the thesis. Texts may be submitted in any language of the European Union, provided with a translation into either Spanish, Italian, English or French in the case the original language is different from one of those hereby specified. An electronic version of the doctoral dissertation and of the summary must be submitted within the aforementioned date to the following e-mail address: dipmat.umi@unibo.it.

Art. 4 The amount of the indivisible prize is 2,000 euros. The winner shall be selected by a board consisting of the president of UMI together with four mathematicians appointed by the Commissione Scientifica of UMI, taking into account the suggestions of Centro Enriques. The decision of the award board is unappealable. The board reserves the right not to award the prize in case none of the works presented is considered to deserve it.

Art. 5 The award shall be attributed on the occasion of the general UMI congress, that will take place in Siena in September 2015

Art. 6 UMI reserves the right to publish, in full or in part, the awarded dissertation, without any further compensation for the author.

Article 7 Participation to the competition implies the full acceptance of the present regulations.
