

# RENATO CACCIOPPOLI PRIZE

## Regulation

### Art. 1

The Italian Mathematical Union (UMI) awards *sine die* a four-year Prize to commemorate professor Renato Caccioppoli. The prize is awarded to researchers in Mathematics.

### Art. 2

The prize is currently funded by the donation of prof. Giovambattista Ceppalunni and by the contribute of the University of Naples “Federico II”, as well as by accrued interests and those to be accrued. In addition to the contribution of the promoters, the prize fund can be increased by further sponsorships from individuals or institutions.

### Art. 3

The prize is awarded by a selection based on scientific qualifications. Starting from December 31<sup>st</sup>, 1998, the call will be announced every four years by December 31<sup>st</sup>.

### Art. 4

The call announcement will be advertised on the ‘Notiziario’ of Italian Mathematical Union. The deadline for the submission of the applications will be at least 60 days after the date of the call announcement.

### Art. 5

The amount of the prize will be established by the UMI Executive Office upon keeping in mind the interests accrued from the investment of the fund.

### Art. 6

Those eligible to the award are researchers in Mathematics of Italian nationality whose 39<sup>th</sup> birthday does not occur by December 31<sup>th</sup> of the year preceding the deadline for submission. This age will be increased by one year both for each child (or parental leave) or for a leave, due to health reasons, longer than 6 months.

### Art. 7

The application forms must be sent to the UMI President exclusively in electronic form. A copy of an identity document attesting nationality and date of birth of the candidate, his/her curriculum vitae, a list of his/her publications and an electronic copy of the publications must be attached to the application in PDF format.

### Art. 8

Only published papers will be admitted.

### Art. 9

Each prize is indivisible and is awarded by a Committee consisting of 5 members appointed by the UMI Executive Office.

Art. 10

The Committee will award the prize considering the whole scientific production of the applicant. The prize might be awarded also to a person who does not submit any application form, but he/she must be under the conditions described in Article 6 of this regulation.

Art. 11

The Committee resolutions may be taken by majority. As regards scientific merit, the Committee resolutions are unquestionable.

Art. 12

If the Committee does not award the prize, it shall be awarded the following year.

Art. 13

The Committee must write a detailed report which will be published on the 'Notiziario'.

Art. 14

This regulation may be amended with the procedures under articles 4 and 5 of 'Offerta di Donazione' by professor Ceppaluni.
